ELECTION RESULTS

On March 09, 2021, the Town of Lantana held a general election for the purpose of electing a candidate for the Office of the Mayor – Group 5. After the closing of the polls, the votes were tabulated as provided by law, and the Palm Beach County Supervisor of Elections provided the certified results as listed below:

ROBERT HAGERTY 860 votes
DAVID J. STEWART 579 votes

IT'S TURTLE SEASON!

Turtle nesting runs annually March through October and is a very exciting and busy time at the beach. These magnificent creatures emerge from the surf at night to lay their eggs and then return to the sea. The season officially started on March 1, and Town staff is always on the lookout for signs and stand ready to protect the nesting sites. Here's what you can do:

During Turtle Season:

- Don't disturb nests
- Don't shine lights on the turtles at night. This can scare female turtles and keep them from nesting.
- Turn off your lights at night when not using them and close blinds at night to avoid adding to the overall sky glow.
- Fill in your beach holes and knock down sea castles so the nesting turtles and hatchlings can't fall into them and aren't hindered.
- Observe turtles from 30 feet.




The Town of Lantana is excited to introduce the web-based 311 Service Request system. The 311 Service Request system gives residents 24/7 access to submit requests and track the progress of currently submitted requests. Your service request is sent directly to the appropriate department for them to complete. Please do not use this system for emergencies.

The 311 Service Request system can be accessed directly by going to www.lantana.org/311 or by selecting the Service Request button on the front page of www.lantana.org.

How to Use This System: There are four steps to creating a service request ticket.

- 1. Log into the system or create an account. We need you to log in so we can respond to you or request additional information, if needed.
- 2. Select a Service Type. Each service request type may be routed to a unique department or team member at the Town.
- 3. Create a Request. Enter the information about your request, including the location of the issue.
- 4. Review and Submit. After describing your request, you can then review and send your request. It will then be linked to your account in the system. You can then log into the portal to manage your requests and see the progress of your request.





YOU ARE INVITED!

Attending a Town Council meeting is one of the best ways to keep up with what is going on in Lantana and be heard. Council meetings are held on the second and fourth Mondays of the month. The Town's budget workshops are held in the Summer and the budget hearings (when the budget is adopted) are held in September. The budget meetings are a great time to learn about how the Town works and how your taxes are being used.

Town Council meetings are also live streamed for listening purposes only. Anyone can listen remotely to the meeting from their computer, tablet or smartphone by following the instructions posted on the agenda.

The Town is seeking input from Lantana Pines residents on a proposal to install an exercise park on Town owned property on W. Central St between S. Broadway and S. Arnold Ave.. Lantana Pines residents, please email **nshawah@lantana.org** for meeting information.

TOWN PARK UPDATE

The Lantana Nature Preserve was reopened to the public on 2/3/21 after the a brief down time that allowed the Town to repair a retaining wall and install approximately 2,200 feet of 6ft wide walking path made of finished concrete. Phase II of the project is pending a permit from the regulatory agencies to complete the remaining portion of the walking trail (about 300 feet).

Bicentennial Park is undergoing a total reconstruction of the public restrooms. Portable restrooms are available. This project is expected to be completed in June 2021. The playground was removed because of age and deterioration. The old playground site will be the home of the Town's Centennial Sculpture. The new playground will be installed between the pavilion and the fishing pier adjacent to the seawall. Additionally, a sidewalk will be installed to connect the fishing pier and the parking lot. All of these improvements are slated to be completed in Jun 2021.

SPRING IS HERE!

To help keep our neighborhoods vibrant, safe and beautiful places to live, Code Enforcement wants you to keep a few tips in mind:

- Did you know the use of gravel and shell rock (including pebbles, rocks, and coquina or similar) is prohibited from being used in driveways and swale areas in the Town of Lantana? Driveways and swales in existence prior to July 19, 2019 are exempt. Please contact the Building Division if you have questions on what materials are permitted, 561-540-5780 or buildingpermitelantana.org
- Please be aware parking a car in the street or blocking a sidewalk, even for a short time, is prohibited. If observed, you will be issued a parking ticket or a Notice of Violation will be issued to the property where the car is parked.
